Rationale

Aims

- 1. To embed the global dimension within the school internal and external curriculum.
- 2. To prepare students for life in a diverse global society and work in a competitive global economy.
- 3. To work with global partners to achieve our educational goal.

Objectives

- To integrate the global dimension into the whole school curriculum by raising staff awareness of valid curriculum links. To welcome to our school teachers and pupils from other countries.
- To develop an awareness of similarities and differences in lifestyle and culture in a range of other countries.
- To involve staff, students and the wider community in the development of contacts with our global partners.
- To research possible involvement in EU and other international programme and promote international vocational links.
- To developing cross-curricular activities with an international theme for all students.
